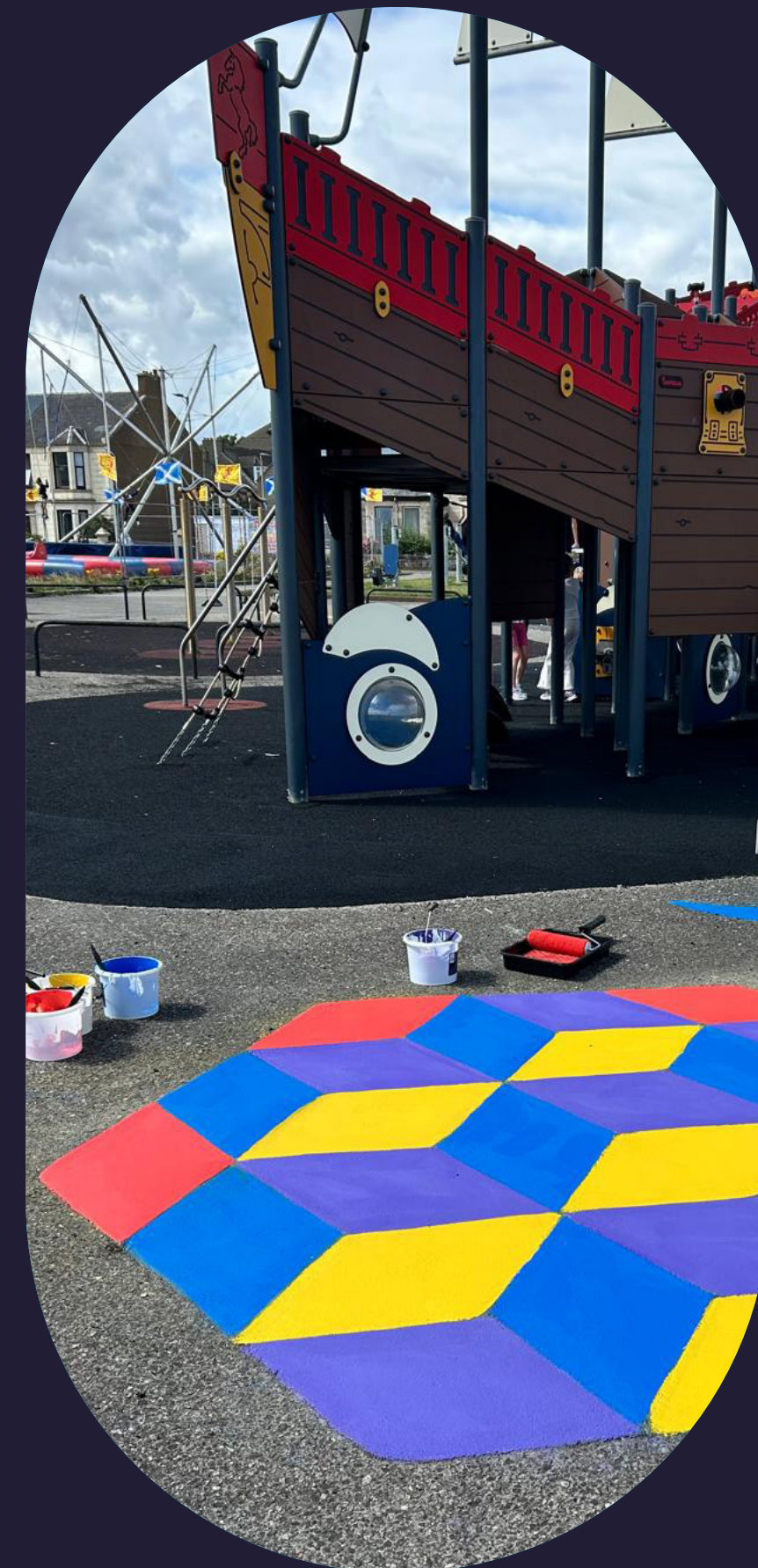

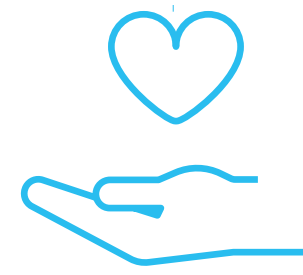

This report showcases and celebrates the collaborative outcomes from the Community Legacy Programme during 2025-2026.

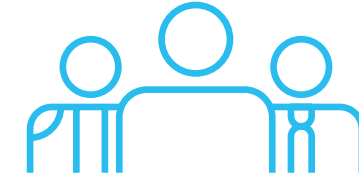


At a Glance

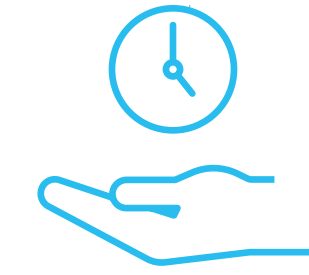

Ayrshire Community Lunch July 2025

Connecting local groups across Ayrshire

In July 2025, SCAPE Scotland and framework delivery partners Arup, AtkinsRealis, Balfour Beatty, Kier, McLaughlin & Harvey, Morgan Sindall Construction, Perfect Circle and RJ McLeod, sponsored and hosted a community lunch for older people living across Ayrshire.

Community groups from across East Ayrshire, North Ayrshire and South Ayrshire were invited to attend an afternoon of food, entertainment and connection. The programme included a shared lunch, sing-along and dancing, human bingo, goody bags and a raffle, creating a warm and welcoming environment designed to bring people together.

Accessibility and inclusivity were key considerations to the event's planning. The Community Legacy Programme group coordinated the full day, including arranging transport to and from the various community hubs to ensure guests could attend comfortably and safely.

A total of 44 guests attended on the day, all of whom were members of community groups dedicated to supporting older adults. The afternoon was met filled with smiles, laughter, and a genuine appreciation, demonstrating the positive impact that collaborative, community-focussed activity can achieve.

The event was hosted at CVO East Ayrshire's community hub, WG13 in Kilmarnock, with the social enterprise providing the refreshments and venue hire.

This initiative marked an important shift in community engagement for the construction and built environment sector, which has traditionally focused on schools and further education settings. By delivering an afternoon centred on food, fun, and fellowship, the Group were able to successfully connect with an often-underrepresented audience, reinforcing the value of inclusive engagement and cross-sector collaboration in strengthening local communities.

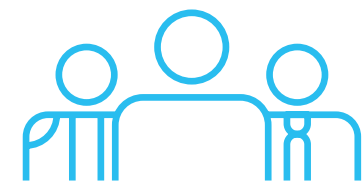

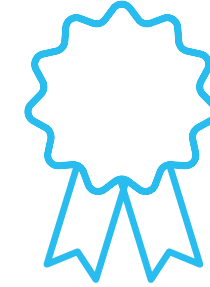

Saltcoats Pirate Playpark June-August 2025

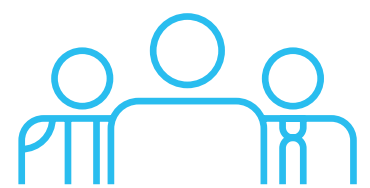
Revitalising community assets

Across two days during summer 2025, SCAPE Scotland and its Construction framework delivery partner, Morgan Sindall Construction, volunteered at the Saltcoats Pirate Playpark to support improvement works on behalf of Saltcoats Active Lifecycle Team.

Volunteers provided hands-on labour to repaint sections of the much-loved community playpark, helping to refresh the space for local families. The initiative was identified through North Ayrshire Council's community wish list and is linked to the Ardrossan Community Campus project currently being delivered through the SCAPE Scotland Construction framework. It demonstrates how community benefit activity can sit alongside project delivery to create meaningful, visible impact in local areas.

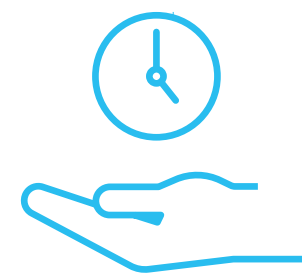

This collaborative effort not only enhanced a valued community asset but also reinforced a shared commitment to leaving a positive legacy beyond construction projects.



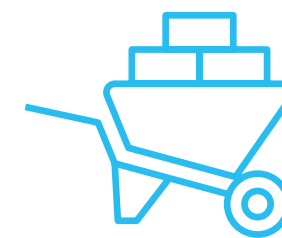

Festive activity to support families in need

Building on the success of last year's campaign, this year's focus was on raising vital funds and collecting gift donations to support disadvantaged children and young people. Cash for Kids works to improve the lives of children affected by poverty, illness and neglect, as well as those facing additional challenges, offering a helping hand to families who need it most.

Through monetary donations, gift vouchers and gift collection points hosted across SCAPE Scotland framework delivery partner offices, the Group collectively raised an incredible £9,793.45 for the charity's Scotland regions.

StartUp Stirling December 2025

Supporting StartUp Stirling

StartUp Stirling operates eight emergency foodbanks across the Stirling Council area, delivering vital support through a mobile service for those unable to access a foodbank for either financial, physical or mental health reasons. Each week, the service supports approximately 300 people across the region, a third of whom are children, by providing emergency food supplies.

With demand increasing in the lead-up to the festive period, the charity welcomed the additional volunteer support to help sort donations and prepare essential food packs and Christmas hampers. Across two days in December, 12 volunteers from SCAPE Scotland and framework delivery partners AtkinsRéalis, Balfour Beatty, Kier Construction, Morgan Sindall Construction, McLaughlin & Harvey and RJ McLeod rolled up their sleeves to assist at StartUp Stirling's distribution warehouse.

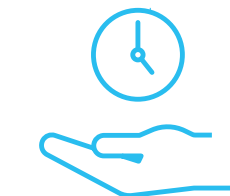
Alongside volunteering their time, the Group also set up collection points across their offices and project sites, encouraging colleagues to donate essential items directly to the charity. Each food pack contains staple items such as dried and tinned foods, designed to feed an individual or family for three to four days. As the charity relies heavily on community donations, packs are supplemented with fresh fruit, vegetables and bread where ever possible using funds raised locally.

Together, the Group contributed an incredible 292kg of donated goods, including additional items to help create Christmas hampers to accompany the charity's essential food packs.

Through this collective effort, the team helped provide a vital lifeline for individuals and families who might otherwise face going hungry, cold or into debt during the winter months.

Chap Discretionary Fund

CHAP is an Ayrshire-based charity that support people with a range of free and confidential housing, debt and welfare issues. Working across the three areas, it also provides education and early intervention services, raising the standards of living for its clients and empowering the local community.

SCAPE Scotland has donated £3,000 to CHAP through SCAPE Reinvest, a social investment fund which provides financial support to local projects and initiatives that respond to needs within the communities that we work. The funding is linked to the community benefit element of the Morgan Sindall Construction led build of the Ardrossan Community Campus through our frameworks. The new Community Campus is currently under construction just a short distance from CHAP's main office in Ardrossan.

The state of the art campus is a major regeneration project for the town, transforming a derelict site with new education and community facilities, including primary and secondary schools, a library, a swimming pool and indoor/outdoor sports spaces.

The funding will go directly into CHAP's Client Discretionary Fund, enabling them to support individuals and families across Ayrshire who are experiencing financial hardship and continue delivering vital advice and assistance to those who need it most.
